How to get from Vilnius airport to the city centre

Vilnius airport is just a bit more than 6 kilometers away from Vilnius city centre or Vilnius Old Town. Here are different ways to go from Vilnius airport to city centre:

1. Getting from Vilnius airport to city centre BY BUS

We really recommend buying tickets for public transport on your phone! If you have data, you can download Trafi App to buy tickets on your phone (0.65 EUR for 30 min ride or 0.90 EUR for 60 min ride).

BUSES

- Bus #1 Airport Bus/Train Station (Oro uostas Stotis) around 15 min
 ride
- Bus #2 Airport Bus /Train Station (Oro uostas Stotis) around 20 min ride

2. Getting from Vilnius airport to city centre BY TRAIN

There's a new modern train going from the airport to the central train station approximately every 40-60 minutes. The ride takes only 7-9 minutes and the ticket costs only €0,70! If you have a lot of luggage with you, this might be the best way for you to get to the city from Vilnius airport as the train is more comfortable than buses. It will take you about 10-15 minutes to walk from the station to Vilnius old town.

3. Getting from Vilnius airport to city centre BY TAXI

We would recommend using BOLT, Uber or eTaksi apps. To reach the city centre from Vilnius airport locals usually pay €5-6.

Documents required for reimbursement

- Reimbursement form;
- Original plane boarding pass/train tickets / bus tickets + invoices, where the price is stated;
- Local transport tickets (tickets for transport in Vilnius).

Depending on your arrival time we will arrange private buses that will take you from Vilnius to Antaliepte, the place where the workshop will take place.

Things to do in Vilnius:

Explore The Old Town

A European city with an old town is nothing new, but they are almost always well worth exploring. If you only have one day in Vilnius, I would highly recommend staying at a hotel in the actual old town and wander around day and night from there. Vilnius's old town is quite large but easy to navigate.

Hike Up To Gediminas' Tower

For the best views of all of Vilnius, it's best to head up to Gediminas' Tower, the remnants of the upper castle. There is also a museum inside for €2.

Three Crosses Hill

Once done with the tower, walk down and head over to the stairs leading to The Three Crosses. At the top, you will find amazing 360 views of Vilnius. The monument is a dedication to Lithuania's dark past with the Soviet Union. In my opinion, this is one of the most extraordinary things to see in Vilnius.
